Dear Friends,

The Southern New England (SNE) Chapter of SWANA is announcing the availability of scholarship awards for current high school students, undergraduates, graduate students, or young professionals.

SNE SWANA Chapter Awards (Stephen Parker Local Chapter Program)

The SNE SWANA Chapter scholarship awards are offered in remembrance of Stephen Parker, a founding member of the Northern New England SWANA Chapter and long-term member of the SWANA International Board of Directors. The SNE SWANA Chapter offers scholarships to eligible student members, and the children and grandchildren of active members on an annual basis. The SNE SWANA Chapter also accepts Young Professional (YP) applications for professionals who have graduated from college within the past five years and are current SWANA members. Eligible candidate categories for SNE SWANA Chapter scholarships are described below.

- Category I: high school senior entering junior or four-year college/university – any field of study. Must have a SWANA member as a sponsor.
- Category II: university junior or senior studying something that has potential for a career in solid waste management. Please note that this is not strictly a science and engineering requirement. The applicant must have a SWANA member as a sponsor or be a SWANA student member or a qualifying SWANA member.
- Category III: full-time graduate student (entering or current graduate students) studying environmental science or studies, engineering or other major applicable to the field of solid waste or resource management. The applicant must have a SWANA member as a sponsor or be a SWANA student member or a qualifying SWANA member.
- Category IV: Young Professional who have graduated from college within the past five years, who are engaged in a career related to the solid waste industry (i.e., engineering, environmental science, etc.), and are a current SWANA member. A "Young Professional" is defined as an individual in the solid waste industry 35 or younger.

Each applicant will only be submitting one application. To be eligible for the SNE SWANA Chapter Scholarship, program applications must be submitted to the SNE Chapter Scholarship Committee on or before July 1, 2025. Applications for SNE Chapter scholarships received after the July 1 deadline will be reviewed on a case-by-case basis. The number of scholarships and award amounts available are



approved by the SNE Chapter Board of Directors based on the recommendations of the SNE Chapter Scholarship Committee; however, the minimum award for any scholarship meeting minimum standards will be \$500.

Scholarship Award Winners

SNE SWANA Chapter scholarship winners will be announced at the annual SNE SWANA Scholarship Golf Tournament scheduled for August 11, 2025, at the LeBaron Hills Country Club in Lakeville, Massachusetts. I. AWARDS:

II. ELIGIBILILTY:

To be eligible to apply satisfy all three requirements:

you must

- Be a graduating high school senior or hold an equivalent level of education
- Be the natural, adopted or step child or grandchild of a SWANA member in good standing at the time of the recommendation who will act as your Sponsor
- Be accepted for enrollment in a two or four-year college or university in any program of study. SWANA's
 membership is diverse and we encourage you to consider how your selected area of study might lead you
 into our professional ranks.

SWANA student members, SWANA employees, and their family members are not eligible to apply for Category I Scholarships. Beyond those exceptions, SWANA pledges to uphold the policy that all persons shall have equal access to this program.

IV. CRITERIA:

The Scholarship Committee evaluates the Category I Scholarship applications on the following basis:

A. Academics = 40% of your total score

SWANA's Scholarship Committee considers past academic performance an important selection criterion. Your application must provide enough information to allow the Scholarship Committee to evaluate your academic performance. Here is a list of REQUIRED and OPTIONAL materials used in evaluating Academic performance.

• **REQUIRED:** Provide a transcript from the high school or equivalent most recently completed.

This transcript may be an official or PDF copy of your high school transcript, but it is required to be attached to the application you provide to the Chapter. The transcript must provide marks for all courses and a measure of your academic performance when measured on the school's standardized scoring system. Identify the scale used (e.g., 4.0 on a 4.0). An example of one possible measure satisfying this request for US based students is grade point average (GPA). SWANA acknowledges that not all schools use this measure and will accept other measures *documented by the transcript*.

 REQUIRED: Provide a copy of your acceptance letter to the college or university you will attend

Your acceptance letter must be attached to the application provided to the Chapter. Failure to provide this documentation is an *automatic disqualification* from further consideration in the Grant Flint Scholarship Program. The name of the college/university will be referenced on the award check issued by SWANA.



• OPTIONAL: Academic achievement, awards, and honors

If applicable, attach documentation of other **academic** performance and/or letters of recommendation related to academic performance that will help the Scholarship Committee evaluate your application.

OPTIONAL: Scores from standardized tests

These items are useful to the Scholarship Committee if included, but may not be relevant to all geographic areas.

- » ACT score. Include a copy of the test return you received or, if you wish to have your score released directly to SWANA, use ACT Code Number 7998 for SWANA Scholarship.
- » SAT score. Include a copy of the test return you received, or if you wish to have your score released directly to SWANA, use SAT Institution Code: 7935, Institution Name: FLINT INTRNTL SCHLR

Extracurricular Activities = 25% of your total score

Extracurricular activities are activities connected with the school but outside the standard curriculum. Students choose to participate in these as part of their school experience. Examples include, but are not limited to:

- · Athletics on school-sponsored teams
- Music, drama, debate, and similar performance-related participation
- School-sponsored clubs
- · Tutoring other students

Describe your participation, including your level of involvement, role, and when it occurred (number of school years, seasons, etc.). Attach documentation and/or letters of recommendation to help the Scholarship Committee appropriately score this part of your application.

C. Community Activities and Citizenship = 25% of your total score

Community activities are programs offered or sponsored by entities other than your school. Examples include but are not limited to:

- Groups and volunteer activities sponsored by faith-based organization (e.g., participation in youth study and activity groups)
- Local community organizations (meal delivery, organized park clean-up, election volunteer, etc.)
- Coaching or officiating youth sports (e.g., Little League, youth soccer programs, etc.)
- · High school ROTC participation or military service
- Employment

Describe what you did and how often you participated. Attach documentation and/or letters of recommendation to help the Scholarship Committee appropriately score this part of your application

D. Essay = 10% of your total score

- REQUIRED: Applicants must write a short, original essay about the topic included in Question
- 8. The Committee will consider:
 - » Relevance to the identified topic
 - » Clarity and organization of the work
 - » Grammar and punctuation
 - » Accuracy and originality



E. Financial Need-not weighted

• OPTIONAL: Although it is not a weighted factor, the Scholarship Committee can take financial need into consideration during its deliberation. Some chapters may also consider financial need in their review of applications. Please do not attach forms that contain confidential personal information.

F. Disqualification

Applying is not a guarantee of funding. The Scholarship Committee may disqualify an application for any of the following reasons.

- Applicant fails to meet the deadline for submitting the application to the Chapter
- · Applicant will not be enrolled in classes in the coming semester
- · Applicant does not provide all REQUIRED documentation identified above
- · Application contains an essay or substantial parts of an essay written by another person
- Application is not legible
- · Application is not signed by the applicant and Sponsor where indicated
